

THREE MILE CREEK GREENWAY TRAIL

Fact Sheet

The Three Mile Creek Greenway Trail will be a linear park system that spans a seven-mile portion of Three Mile Creek, extending eastward from Langan Park to Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Avenue. The Greenway will include a system of paved trails, trailheads, sidewalks, and bike lanes to provide non-motorized transportation options and opportunities to socialize, walk, run, play, learn, and enjoy the outdoors.

WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT?

The Three Mile Creek Greenway Trail is a community amenity that provides access to one of Mobile's most beautiful natural assets. For over 35-years, citizens, non-profits and government agencies have been envisioning a pedestrian and biking trail along Three Mile Creek. The City has organized an implementation plan, secured funding from multiple sources, and is undertaking design and construction of the greenway trail in multiple phases. The trail will be accessible to everyone, regardless of age or ability. When complete, Three Mile Creek Greenway Trail will be within 1-mile of 70,000 residents and have city-wide benefits related to the local economy, personal health, and the environment. Recently acquired Restore Act funding has allowed the construction of three segments of the greenway.


